General Law - Part I, Title XIV, Chapter 90, Section 24

Chapter 90, Section 24 (1) (a) (1) provides the Massachusetts definition of operating under the influence. It provides that anyone that operates a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol content of .08% or higher or while under the influence of alcohol, marijuana, narcotic drugs, depressants or stimulants, or the smelling or inhaling the fumes of any substance having the property of releasing toxic vapors is guilty of OUI.

Massachusetts OUI Statute, Chapter 90, Section 24 | OUI ...

If a person has not been previously arrested for or charged with a violation under said section 24, 24G or 24L, such person shall, if he consents, be assigned to a program specifically designed by the department of public health for the treatment of underage drinking drivers; provided, however, that such assignment shall not be precluded by a finding or disposition upon a charge against such person under said section 24, 24G or 24L.

The police officer before whom such refusal was made shall, within 24 hours, prepare a report of such refusal. Each report shall be made in a format approved by the registrar and shall be made under the penalties of perjury by the police officer before whom such refusal was made.

Section 24E: Dismissal of charges upon compliance with terms of probation; records; reports. Section 24E. The provisions of this section shall apply to any person convicted of or charged with operating a motor vehicle with a percentage, by weight, of alcohol in their blood of eight one-hundredths or greater, or while under the influence of intoxicating liquor provided said person is qualified for a disposition under section twenty-four D.

Under Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 90 Section 24, the RMV will suspend/revoke a your learner's permit/driver's license or right to operate after receiving notification from a court of a conviction for Operating Under the Influence (OUI) of alcohol or drugs.

General Laws of Massachusetts - Chapter 90 Motor Vehicles ...

As stated in Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 90, Section 20, the RMV will suspend or revoke your learner's permit, driver's license, or right to operate for 30 days if you are found responsible for 3 speeding tickets (including out-of-state offenses) in any 12-month period.This period is calculated from the most recent finding or conviction date.

If a landlord makes an emergency entry in the tenant's absence, the landlord shall give the tenant actual notice within 24 hours after the entry, and the notice shall include the fact of the entry, the date and time of the entry, the nature of the emergency and the names of the persons who entered.

Whoever operates a motor vehicle in violation of paragraph (a) of subdivision (1) of section 24, sections 24G or 24L, subsection (a) of section 8 of chapter 90B, sections 8A or 8B of chapter 90B or section 131/2 of chapter 265, while his license or right to operate has been suspended or revoked, or after notice of such suspension or revocation of his right to operate a motor vehicle has been issued and received by such person or by his agent or employer, and prior to the restoration of such ...
