Florida does not have a law mandating that a real estate closing take place in the county where the real property is located. However, many sale/purchase form contracts include pre-printed provisions indicating where the closing must take place.

Florida's Real Estate Referral Law

In a real property transaction, "buyer" means a transferee or lessee, and "seller" means the transferor or lessor." (Section 475.2755, Florida Statutes) The Designated Sales Associate law does not apply to residential sales, as defined in 475.278.

Under Florida law, property owners are entitled to a Homestead Exemption - a tax-saving vehicle - if, as of January 1st, they made a property their permanent home or the permanent home of a person who is legally or naturally dependent on them. Seller Disclosure Requirements in Florida. State law in Florida (Johnson v. Davis, 480 So.2d 625 (Fla. 1985)) requires sellers to disclose any known facts or conditions about their property that have a substantial impact on the value of the property and that others cannot easily observe.

Florida law protects the decedent's surviving spouse and certain surviving children from total disinheritance. For example, a surviving spouse may have rights in the decedent's homestead real property. A surviving spouse also may have the right to come forward to claim an "elective share" from the decedent's probate estate.

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
