Inpatient nocturia care plan (with or without nocturnal enuresis) Problem or issue identified Nocturia (with or without nocturnal enuresis). Patient/nursing objective To improve night time bladder pattern by trying to reduce the number of voids overnight. Nursing action Initial Date Exclude urinary tract infection. If infection present treat as necessary.

Handwashing and perineal care reduce skin irritation and risk of ascending infection. Refer to urinary continence specialist as indicated. Collaboration with specialists is helpful for developing individual plan of care to meet patient's specific needs using the latest techniques, continence products. Nursing Assessment nursing care plans for Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia (BPH) BPH Clinical features depend on the extent of prostatic enlargement and on the lobes affected. Patient history , generally, men with suspected BPH have a history of frequent urination, nocturia, straining to urinate, weak stream, and an incomplete emptying of the bladder

NCP Nursing Care Plan For Benign Prostatic Hyperplasia ...

Urinary Retention Care [0620] Instruct Mr. Baker or a family member to record urinary output. Catheterize for residual urine, as appropriate. Implement intermittent catheterization, as appropriate. Serves as an indicator of urinary tract and renal function and of fluid balance. An enlarged prostate compresses the urethra so that urine is re-retained.

Asplund (2004) reports that 24-hour urine output is usually normal or only slightly increased when a patient presents with nocturia, but that there is a shift in diuresis from daytime to night-time. This is thought to be a result of vasopressin system disruption.

PATIENT TEACHING. Instruct patients about the need to maintain a high fluid intake (at least 2 L/day) to ensure adequate urine output. Teach the patient to monitor urinary output for 4 to 6 weeks after surgery to ensure adequacy in volume of elimination combined with a decrease in volume of retention. MEDICATIONS. Provide instructions about all medications used to relax the smooth muscles of the bladder or to shrink the prostate gland.

Nursing Care Plan Help-Impaired Urinary Elimination ...

The management plan at this time is to discuss a different drug management plan with cardiology to see whether or not she is a candidate for a class III drug in view of the patient's intolerance to digoxin and/or quinidine. She may well tolerate digoxin at a lower dose, but the problem is it is not effectively blocking her ventricular response.

Nursing care plan intervention and treatment plan Periodic observation, or "watchful waiting," may be proposed to a patient with early-stage, less-aggressive prostate cancer. With this option, no specific treatment is given, but the progression of the disease is monitored via periodic diagnostic tests.

Wear cotton underwear and avoid tight fitting clothing. Apply heating pad for comfort. Application of heat to lower back or abdomen may help relieve pain and cramping. Avoid prolonged exposure to heating pad, using only 15 minutes per session with at least 15-30 minutes in between to prevent burns.

Nursing Care Plan for Urinary Tract Infection (UTI) ...

In both the hospital and home care setting, patients may be following medication schedules that require awakening in the early morning hours. Instruct patient to follow as consistent a daily schedule for retiring and arising as possible. This promotes regulation of the circadian rhythm, and reduces the energy required for adaptation to changes.

Patient Plans of Institutional providers such as acute hospitals, psychiatric hospitals, . Care. and Nursing Facilities Level B must include a written Plan of Care in each patient's medical record. Physicians were interviewed and asked about the plan of care in the same fashion as for the patients. Two board-certified internists reviewed responses and rated patient-physician agreement on each aspect of the plan of care as none, partial, or complete agreement. RESULTS: Of 250 eligible patients, 241 (96%) agreed to be interviewed.
